




- In Q2 2008, the real GDP growth rate in Georgia was 7.9%, with growth accelerating (compared to Q1 2008) in Industry, Transportation, Communications, Financial Intermediation, Real Estate, Education and Healthcare.
- GDP deflator index increased in Q2 2008 by 13%.

## Annual real GDP growth rate











• In Q2 2008, GDP per capita increased by 42.5% y-o-y to US\$788.3.
